These legal reforms, coupled with other proposed changes, will contribute toward reinvigorating Wisconsin's overall business climate.

A recent study by the Pacific Research Institute (PRI) found that, when comparing states' current tort laws and procedures, Wisconsin ranked 35th in the nation. This ranking is consistent with other nationally recognized indices that have continually downgraded Wisconsin's litigation climate during the last decade.
